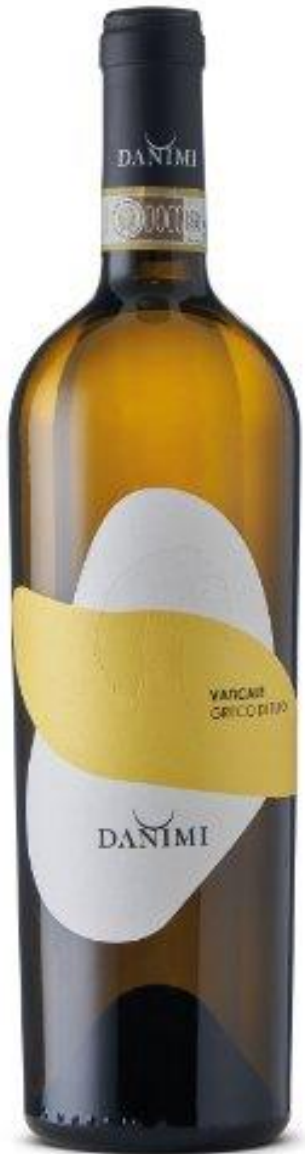


Greco di Tufo Vaticale - Danimi



Tasting Notes

Straw yellow, hints of peach and blueberry with ash and iodine notes. Mineral and oregano on the palate, with a finish of citrus peel.

Vaticale \va tee KA lay\

The name, *Vaticale*, pays homage to the now-forgotten profession of cart-driver, whose job it was to transport the grapes from the mountainous vineyards to the winery. Greco is an ancient varietal, believed to have been originally brought to the region by the Greeks and has been cultivated in Avellino for hundreds of years. The *vaticale* is part of this long tradition.

Greco di Tufo \GREH ko dee TOO fo\

Greco grapes from around the town of Tufo make the region's most prestigious white wine, and one of the very few white DOCG wines in Southern Italy. Cultivated since Roman times in Campania, the chalky soil of this volcanic region is evident in the wine, which combines a beautiful structure with pleasant mineral notes and a perfumed bouquet.
